

 publication of trade regulations procedures (transparency)


Digital TF:

 SMEs represented in the National Trade Facilitation Committee




Global average stands 65% Southeast and East Asia leading developing countries








Progress of Global Implementation (by region)

Implementation of General and Digital TF Measures


"Paperless trade" implementation rates vary greatly depending on the individual measures



Implementation of cross-border paperless trade measures







Trade Digitalization: Benefits from cross-paperless trade facilitation

- Full implementation of cross-border paperless trade is expected to result in 13% trade cost reduction (up to 26%)
- and an increase in global trade by at least \$750 billion a year



On-going initiatives to enhance trade digitalization (non-exhaustive)

- G7 Trade Minister's Digital Trade Principles
- UN Framework Agreement on Facilitation of Cross-Border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific
- Digitization of documents under various transport and trade-related UN conventions (eTIR, eCMR, eCITES...)
- UNCITRAL model law on electronic transferable records (MLETR),
- UN/CEFACT Recommendations and package of standards, WCO data model
- ICC Digital Standards Initiative
- ...



Accelerating Digital TF through the *Framework*Agreement on Facilitation of Cross-border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific

The enabling UN treaty entered into force in 2021

Article 1: Objective

The objective of the present Framework Agreement is **to promote cross-border paperless trade** by enabling the exchange and mutual recognition of trade-related data and documents in electronic form and facilitating interoperability among national and subregional single windows and/or other paperless trade systems, for the purpose of **making international trade transactions more efficient and transparent while improving regulatory compliance**.







Accelerating Digital TF through the Framework Agreement on Facilitation of Cross-border Paperless Trade in Asia and the Pacific

- 100% increase in number of acceding parties in 2022 now 11 parties
- Most inclusive and and cooperative platform for progress
- Join to demonstrate highlevel commitment to digital trade transformation


